Sports Day:

The sports day was originally planned for October 4, however bad weather meant that it was postponed to October 6. The morning was cool, but the weather was clear, and students started gathering at Keika's Urawa Ground at 8am. Although it wasn't long before it started getting very windy, causing dust storms throughout the day.

This year's sports day was a bit different to previous years, as students were responsible for running the events and leading each other. Teachers were helping, but it was up to the students to make the day a success.

Classes were split into 4 teams, with students from different grades working together to achieve victory.

The day proceeded smoothly, with students (and some teachers) competing in more than a dozen events throughout the day. These events included: individual races (100m dash, bread eating race, obstacle course, and burrowing race);

group events (class jumprope, 3-legged race, elective relay, class relay);















and events with students from all grades working together (cavalry fight,

centipede race, and the big ball roll).



There were also extra events like the club relay and teacher relay.



The day ended with blue team taking first place with 828 points, red team in

second place with 803 points, yellow team in third with 778 points, and green team in last place with 536 points.
