new classes, met their new teachers, and started their new school life at Kei-Sho. No doubt they were feeling anxious about their new school, and excited for the new possibilities.


The ceremony was held as usual, by which I mean as it was before Covid-19. The Keika Band performed the arrival and school songs. As always they were excellent.
